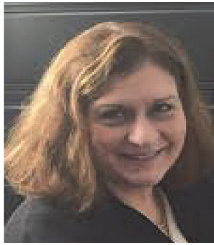




Rachel Levine, MD

Dr. Levine is currently the Pennsylvania physician and professor of Pediatrics and Psychiatry at the Penn State College of Medicine. Her previous posts included: vice-chair for Clinical Affairs for the Department of Pediatrics and chief of the Division of Adolescent Medicine and Eating Disorders at the Penn State Hershey Children’s Hospital-Milton S. Hershey Medical Center. She graduated from Harvard College in 1979 and the Tulane University School of Medicine in 1983. She completed training in Pediatrics at the Mt. Sinai Medical Center in New York City in 1987 and then did a Fellowship in Adolescent Medicine at Mt. Sinai from 1987-88.



Sharon Watkins, PhD

Dr. Watkins is the director of the Bureau of Epidemiology and the state epidemiologist. Prior to accepting a position with the Pennsylvania Department of Health, Dr. Watkins served as the chief of the Bureau of Epidemiology at the Florida Department of Health. Under Dr. Watkins’ leadership, the Bureau of Epidemiology is focused on the expansion of an environmental health program related to fracking, the development of a comprehensive program for the evaluation of healthcare-acquired infections and the continued effort to help stem the heroin and prescription drug crisis in Pennsylvania.

In this role, she provides health and safety education and technical assistance to early care and education programs that participate in Keystone STARS. 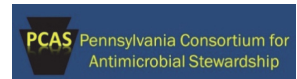
Nicole Hackman, MD
