JOHN Q. TROJANOWSKI, M.D. PH.D., is the Director of the Institute on Aging, Director of the Alzheimer's Disease Core Center, Director of the Morris K. Udall Parkinson's Disease Research Center of Excellence, and Co-Director of the Center for Neurodegenerative Disease Research at Penn's School of Medicine. He is the William Maul Measey-Truman G. Schnable Jr., M.D. Professor of Geriatric Medicine and Gerontology, and Professor of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine. For more than 15 years he has conducted research on Alzheimer's disease (AD), Parkinson's Disease (PD), Motor Neuron Disease (MND), dementia with Lewy bodies (DLB), frontotemporal dementias (FTDs) and related disorders with a focus on the pathobiology of these disorders, especially the role of abnormal filamentous protein aggregates in these diseases.

VIRGINIA M.-Y. LEE, PH.D., M.B.A., is the Director of the Center for Neurodegenerative Disease Research and Co-director of the Marian S. Ware Alzheimer Drug Discovery Program at Penn's School of Medicine. She is the John H. Ware 3rd Professor in Alzheimer's Research in the Department of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine. Dr. Lee's research focuses on the pathogenesis of Alzheimer's disease (AD), Parkinson's disease (PD), frontotemporal dementias (FTDs), Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS) and related neurodegenerative disorders of aging.
