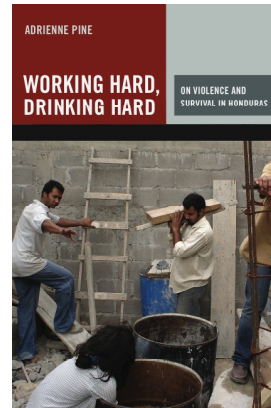

The International War Machine and Health: The Case of Honduras

In a country with a murder rate among the highest in the world, where nurses earn USD\$170 a month and doctors sometimes earn even less, and where former CIA-trained death squad members run private security companies in charge of carrying out genocidal police policies imported from New York, it's hard to stay focused on preventive health care. This talk examines the broad health impacts of an under-recognized war being fought against the people of Honduras through structural adjustment programs, colonialist ideologies, and guns—and our role in it.
