Fran Barg PhD MEd

Dr. Barg is an Assistant Professor of Family Medicine and Community Health at UPenn's School of Medicine and an Assistant Professor in Medical Anthropology in the Department of Anthropology. Her research focuses on the use of mixed methods research as it applies to understanding the uneven distribution of risk and disease among ethnic groups.

Dr. Cronholm is an Assistant Professor of Family Medicine and Community Health at UPenn's School of Medicine. His research focuses on health services regarding intimate partner violence, psychosocial needs of families and patients with cancer, adolescent depression, pre-teen violence prevention, and neighborhood variables on firearm injury and health.
