The office of Global Health Programs works with Biomedical Postdoctoral Programs to recruit international postdoctoral fellows in the life sciences who are interested in working at the University of Pennsylvania. Global Health Programs organizes institutional and individual agreements with institutions to offer their PhD and medical graduates postdoctoral fellowship opportunities at Penn.

We have established **agreements with a number of international institutions**, that are listed on our website at

Students **from these institutions only** who wish to explore a possible fellowship at Penn may complete a Registration Form available on the Global Health Programs website at the address above.

Registration information will be entered in a database that Penn faculty can access to find potential postdoctoral trainees. Conversely, registered students may use a Penn faculty database to identify a potential mentor. Potential trainees and potential mentors then communicate directly to determine if there is a good “fit” for both.

Once the trainee and mentor conclude an agreement, the office of Biomedical Postdoctoral Programs oversees the details of the agreement.

Global Health Programs coordinates global activities of the School of Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania, and supports the international aspects of our research, educational, and service programs. Our activities include: (i) placement of Penn medical students in international rotations, and hosting of international medical students at Penn; (ii) recruitment of postdoctoral fellows who come from international institutions; (iii) facilitation of international research initiatives and sponsored programs undertaken by faculty of the School of Medicine; (iv) coordination of global activities with other schools of the University, and the Office of the Provost; (v) provision of information for faculty, students, and administration; and (vi) representation of the School of Medicine in interactions with international Universities. The GHP Office was opened on July 1, 2004.
