Application Deadline:

March 16, 2026

- Eligible applicants: post-doctoral (MD or PhD) trainees, graduate students, or junior faculty (assistant professor, lecturer who have not yet received an R01) at the University of Pennsylvania conducting ADRD research
- Write an essay (no longer than 4 pages) that includes your background, qualifications, research focus, career goals, potential research project and mentors (if identified), and financial support with justification.
- NIH format biosketch
- Include a cover page that includes your full name, address, email and telephone number
