## ASEF-PSOM Executive Council Meeting February 28, 2017, Wood Room, John Morgan Bldg

The meeting was called to order by Kramer at 12:00 pm.

**Old Business**: Minutes were reviewed and approved.

Guest **Kevin Mahoney**, Executive Vice President, University of Pennsylvania Health System and Executive Vice Dean, Perelman School of Medicine was introduced. He gave a comprehensive overview of the new Patient Care building, under construction where the former Penn Tower building stood. He described the team, led by the distinguished architect, Norman Foster, and told us about the target costs and penalties for over runs. He presented details of the patient rooms, capabilities and plans for traffic. In response to questions, he said this will be a "100 year" building and that much of the material required has already been bought.

**President's report**: Eve Higginbotham has prepared an "Inclusion and Diversity Report" that shows significant progress has been achieved in the past six years; however, more needs to be done. The report was circulated to members of the Executive Council.

Kramer received a letter from Paul Rozin who is interested in revisiting the concept of a Penn Retirement Community. He has received some encouragement from the Administration and is assembling a committee to look into this; Kendal, a non-profit Quaker organization may be interested. Heyner asked Saunders to review the previous attempts to establish such a community. Saunders gave the background of the previous study (that was rejected by the University Administration), but said that the earlier survey is dated and needs to be redone. Obaid was told it would be for standing faculty only, but Shaman said that was not the case. Kramer will be on that committee and will get back to Paul Rozin, indicating our interest.

Dates for next years' ASEF meetings were discussed. Kramer feels that the fourth Tuesday puts us at a disadvantage, and so the Council agreed to move the meetings to the third Tuesday of the month. Shaman said all PASEF meetings are on Wednesdays in the middle of the month, so there would be no conflict.

**Vicki Mulhern**: The searches for the Chairs of Surgery, Biochemistry and Biophysics and the Systems Pharmacology and Translational Therapeutics are ongoing, as well as the search for the Senior Vice Dean for Medical Education, as Gail Morrison is stepping down. Other new developments include the reappointment of Dean Jameson by President Gutmann; initiation by Dean Jameson of Strategic Plan 2.0: Shaping the Future of Medicine; 2017 Commencement on 5/14/17 in Verizon Hall at the Kimmel Center; the opening of the Penn Medicine Commons on the 15<sup>th</sup> floor of the South Tower Extension, a space to promote networking and community

building among the faculty; initiatives to expand teaching opportunities; discussion of changes in the promotion criteria in the Academic Clinician track.

Various initiatives have been launched to raise awareness regarding implicit bias in hiring and in the general environment.
