

Onsite CAPS Counselor for BGS Students - Wednesdays, 12:00pm-4:00pm

Please note: This coming Wednesday, 8/7, is the last summer date scheduled with Tiffany, the onsite CAPS counselor for BGS students. We are working with CAPS to schedule sessions for the fall and will announce details once they are finalized.

Reminder: BGS has arranged for a counselor from <u>Counseling and Psychological Services (CAPS)</u> to be available to meet on site with BGS students on **Wednesdays from noon to 4:00pm Smilow Conference Room 1-103** (in the hallway south of Rubenstein Auditorium). Tiffany Brown, PhD, is a psychologist at CAPS who will provide confidential services every Wednesday afternoon **through August 7th**. She will work with BGS students to provide initial consultation, support, brief counseling, and referral services. In order to set up an appointment with Dr. Brown, you may call CAPS at 215-898-7021 and let them know you would like to meet with Dr. Brown onsite in the PSOM. Alternatively, you may email her directly at <u>nicobr@upenn.edu</u> to make an appointment. All of the meetings will be held in Smilow Conference Room 1-103 (in the hallway south of Rubenstein Auditorium). If the door is open, you may walk in and schedule an appointment with Dr. Brown, in person, for the same day or a future date.

You will still have the option of going to CAPS at 3624 Market Street, and you may call CAPS at any time, 215-898-7021, and talk to a clinician. Grants for Penn Dental Insurance and Family/Dependent Health Insurance

The University is offering two grants to help BGS PhD students offset insurance costs:

Dental Insurance: The Office of the University Provost will reimburse you for 50% of the cost of dental insurance if you sign up <u>by October 11, 2019</u>. You are responsible for the full cost of purchasing the insurance and may incur late fees if these are not paid on time. The reimbursement (\$215) will be issued by early November. Family/Dependent Insurance: Beginning on August 27, 2019, you will be able to apply for grants to help offset the cost of family or dependent insurance. HHMI Gilliam Fellowships for Advanced Study

BGS is pleased to announce that **Natasha Lopes Fischer** is a winner of the **2019 Gilliam Fellowships for Advanced Study**, from the Howard Hughes Medical Institute (HHMI). Natasha is a CAMB MVP student, working in the lab of **Dr. Sunny Shin.** Her research is focused on the innate immune mechanisms to Coxiella burnetii. She is investigating the role of the host inflammasome pathway in detecting Coxiella within infected cells and determining whether the bacteria can inhibit activation of this host immune response.

The Gilliam Fellowship program was created in 2004, with the goal of increasing diversity among scientists who are prepared to assume leadership roles in science. The program provides awards to pairs of students and their dissertation advisers who are selected for their scientific leadership and commitment to advance diversity and inclusion in the sciences. New NIA Pre-doctoral Funding Mechanism for 3rd and 4th Year Students

The National Institute on Aging (NIA) has recently announced a new initiative to support transition of outstanding graduate students, from a wide range of research areas, into aging-related postdoctoral research.

Below are some highlights of the Transition to Aging Research Award for Postdoctoral Students (F99/K00) program: <u>https://grants.nih.gov/grants/guide/rfa-files/RFA-AG-20-009.html</u>

- Predoctoral students at their 3rd and 4th year of PhD, regardless of their research focus, are eligible to apply.
- Visa holders with proper institutional support letter are also eligible to apply for this opportunity; refer to the 'eligibility' section of the announcements for more details.
- The program has two phases: Dissertation (F99, up to 2 years) and aging-related postdoctoral (K00, up to 4 years) phases.

Postdoc Preview introduces upper-level graduate students in the biomedical sciences to the excellent research and training opportunities at the University of Michigan. During a fully-funded visit, recruits interview with two or more prospective mentors, learn about NIH-funded training programs, and network with current postdocs (<u>tentative schedule here</u>). Applicants are selected from a national pool of highly qualified individuals who expect to complete their thesis research over the course of the next year and be U.S. citizens or permanent residents or be currently enrolled in a U.S. graduate institution. Applications are now being accepted for the Ohio State University 2019 Fall **Postdoctoral Recruitment Event**, being held **October 23-25, 2019**. This event will provide an excellent opportunity for outstanding postdocs and PhD students from leading graduate programs to meet research faculty, interview for open postdoctoral positions and discover the exciting and innovative research taking place at The Ohio State University and the Research Institute at Nationwide Children's Hospital (NCH). Selected candidates will visit the Ohio State campus, network with current OSU and NCH postdocs, present their research, interview with prospective mentors, and learn more about postdoctoral opportunities at Ohio State.
