

Penn Libraries full-text online approaches 6.3 million through HathiTrust

By virtue of the Penn Libraries participation in the <u>Hathi Trust Digital Library</u>, Penn scholars will have, on an emergency basis, access to a collection of e-books that matches more than **1.2 Million volumes in Penn's print collections**. This comprises some **40% of the book and serials content physically housed in campus libraries**that are unavailable to our students and faculty because of the COVID-19 emergency. Links to this material have been added to **records in the Libraries' catalog**, <u>Franklin</u>. Thus, any book recorded in Franklin that has a counterpart in **the Hathi Digital Library will be available for online reading and e-loan**.

Franklin also contains some 3 million, public domain items of the Hathi Trust that have been accessible since 2014. **Technology developed by the Penn Libraries** has placed Franklin in the virtually unique position of integrating the Hathi collection into an already vast discovery and access platform. **Franklin is therefore a key resource in the support of the virtual services** that Penn students, faculty, and staff are so reliant on in the current health crisis.

In recent weeks, the Libraries has dramatically expanded ebook content in response to the **COVID-19 emergency**. Some 36,000 additional ebooks are under licensing, bring the **current**

ebook collection to approximately 2,050,000 titles. With our two caches of Hathi Digital collections, the **total number of works available in full-text online approaches 6.3 million**.
