

Technology Grants

BGSA and other student groups have agreed to deploy their unused funds to support technology expenses incurred by full-time graduate students as a direct result of disruptions to the Spring 2020 semester. Special PSIP Enrollment Period

In response to COVID-19 pandemic, the Penn Student Insurance Plan (PSIP) will be offering a special enrollment period for uninsured Penn students and their dependents. **The special enrollment period will run from 4/13/2020– 4/30/2020**. Applications will not be accepted outside of this time frame.

Coverage will be offered for the time period of 4/1/2020 - 7/31/2020. The rate for the 4/1/2020 - 7/31/2020 will be \$1,195 for a student, spouse or child; \$2,390 for two or more children.

Other Important changes to PSIP in response to the COVID-19 outbreak

- The Student Health Service Referral requirement is lifted for remainder of plan year.
- Telehealth services are available to all PSIP enrollees.
- Aetna will waive co-pays for all diagnostic testing related to COVID-19.

Call for Volunteers: One Extra Bag

We are writing to tell you about a new coronavirus relief initiative, One Extra Bag, and ask you for your help!

Who we are

As you probably now, many Philadelphians are facing food insecurity during the Coronavirus pandemic due to both new financial constraints and difficulty leaving their home safely to get groceries. With the help of Penn med faculty, a group of medical students founded a grocery delivery service called One Extra Bag: House Calls to address this problem. One Extra Bag offers free grocery delivery to homebound patients and covers the cost of groceries for any included patients that are unable to pay for food right now.

Why we need your help

Now that our program is expanding, we are reaching out to BGS students because we need more student volunteers to help meet our growing patient need. Volunteering with us would consist of being paired with one of our patients, reaching out to your paired patient over the phone once a week, and doing your patients grocery shopping in addition to your own when you go to the store every week (you would be reimbursed either by the patient or by One Extra Bag). FYI this volunteer opportunity is best-suited for students that have a car.

What we are doing to keep you safe while volunteering

Our protocol has been approved by the School of Medicine and is compliant with all social distancing guidelines. Our key safety features include:

- Having volunteers add on their paired patients' grocery shopping to their regularly scheduled weekly trip (i.e. no extra trips to the store that might risk exposure)
- Asking students to use only their personal vehicle for transportation
- Having all grocery hand offs happen with at least six feet of distance maintained between each patient and volunteer
