Special PSIP Enrollment Period

In response to COVID-19 pandemic, the Penn Student Insurance Plan (PSIP) will be offering a special enrollment period for uninsured Penn students and their dependents. **The special enrollment period will run from 4/13/2020– 4/30/2020**. Applications will not be accepted outside of this time frame.

Coverage will be offered for the time period of 4/1/2020 - 7/31/2020. The rate for the 4/1/2020 - 7/31/2020 will be \$1,195 for a student, spouse or child; \$2,390 for two or more children.

I am a third-year medical student at the University of Pennsylvania, but I'm writing to you as the founder and director of a city-wide student group called the <u>Philadelphia Organization of Health Professions Students (POHPS -- check out our Instagram page for more info)</u>.

I'm writing to share a bit of information about POHPS, how you can get involved in our COVIDrelated efforts, and what resources and programs we offer that may be of interest to you. We're a coalition of over 2,500 students from various health- and health-related graduate programs across the Philadelphia area, and we have been working to combat the COVID crisis and its effects on our communities in a variety of ways, including:

- **Collecting and distributing PPE** and other limited resources that can be utilized in healthcare facilities through our group called PPE2PHL, in close collaboration with the Philadelphia Department of Public Health and the CDC to optimize distribution based on immediate hospital need you can learn more on the <u>PPE2PHL Instagram page</u>;
- Developing and sharing a large collection of informational resources, including:

 COVID-related information and advice (in multiple languages and in the form of a daily newsletter, regular vlog series and an upcoming podcast)
 Public support programs,
 - volunteer opportunities based on the needs of collaborating community programs
- Conducting the pilot study for the <u>Connect for COVID-19 program</u>, which involves collecting and distributing tablets to install in patient rooms to allow them to communicate with their friends and family members outside of the hospital to address the current "no visitors" restrictions*

In addition to our opportunities for student involvement in COVID-related efforts, we also have various programs designed to promote wellness and social engagement during this time of social distancing. These programs are aimed towards <u>Health Professions/Graduate Students and members</u> of the general public (programs include virtual meditation, virtual meet-ups and buddy systems, and yoga) as well as <u>Health Care Workers in the area</u>.
