

Fall 2020 Technology Grants

Deadline: September 18 at 12 noon

Applications are now open for Fall 2020 Technology Grants! The Office of the Provost and GAPSA are funding these grants to support new technology expenses that are required to make academic progress during the Fall 2020 semester. Graduate and professional students who demonstrate financial need <u>may apply for grants</u> (up to \$500) related to new technology needs required to remotely conduct research, take courses, or teach courses during the Fall 2020 semester.

Grants for Penn Dental Insurance and Family/Dependent Health Insurance

We wanted to let you know about two grants the University is offering to help offset insurance costs:

Dental Insurance: The Office of the University Provost will reimburse you for 50% of the cost of dental insurance if you sign up <u>by September 18, 2020</u>. You are responsible for the full cost of purchasing the insurance and may incur late fees if these are not paid on time. The reimbursement
