

GENERAL ANNOUNCEMENTS

COVID-19 Testing and Vaccinations

Testing. Graduate students who live on campus or come to campus each week must be tested. You may enroll in Penn Cares Testing or in COVID SAFE – but you should not be enrolled in both simultaneously. If you are working in a lab in CHOP, Wistar, or another affiliate and are NOT entering Penn/PSOM buildings, you should follow those entities' testing protocols and do NOT need to enroll in University testing. You may receive automated emails about testing even though you are not enrolled in Penn Cares Testing; you may ignore these emails.

Red PennOpen Pass? If you signed up for Penn Cares testing but are not scheduled for a weekly test, you may get a red PennOpen pass. You will need to schedule your weekly test in order to be given a green pass. If you are no longer coming to campus weekly or have switched to COVID SAFE, please email Judy Jackson, jajackso@pennmedicine.upenn.edu to arrange to be un-enrolled from Penn Cares. Please refer to Perelman School of Medicine email of 1/25/21 4:24pm for more details about testing.

Vaccinations. Penn and the PSOM have begun rolling out vaccinations. Please refer to Penn's Vaccinations site for more information.

Penn Chinatown Charter Service - Saturdays 1-4pm ET

Penn Charter Bus going from campus to Chinatown (and vice versa) is for Penn faculty, post-docs, staff and students.

Reserve your seat(s) to and from Chinatown. Be sure to register for seats to Chinatown AND seats back to Penn, if needed.

- Guests must enter the bus through the front door and exit through the rear door.
- Guests must display with bus driver a valid Daily COVID Screening Pass or participate in driver screening and offer a verbal attestation.
- Face masks or coverings must be worn at all times.
- Guests must observe physical distancing and sit in the designated "open" seats.
- Maximum occupancy for each bus is 20 guests and 1 driver.
- No eating or drinking while aboard the vehicle.

The route is named "Chinatown Charter – PAACH, UA, & GAPSA." **The Chinatown Charter is accessible on the PennRides App** or at www.upenn.edu/pennrides via any web browser when using a computer or a mobile device. Real-Time Bus Tracking and route options and will be active from 12pm to 5pm, each Saturday there is service.

(NEW) - Join your fellow Quakers and request your mail-in ballot today

Did you know that more than half of Penn students who voted in the last Philadelphia local election voted by mail?

This cycle there are important local offices, such as District Attorney, and ballot measures, such as adding a state constitutional ban on racial discrimination. These offices and measures have a direct impact on the Penn community and your Penn experience.

Politicians often win by single digit votes in primary elections, so Penn students are poised to have a significant impact. Penn is a Voter Friendly Campus for a reason–keep up the tradition of voting in every election and join your peers at the ballot box!

This semester's primary will occur on May 18th, after finals. Unless you plan to remain in Philadelphia until after commencement, you should vote by mail as soon as possible.

How about right now? It only takes 2 minutes to request your ballot online.

Ballot request forms **must be received** by the Philadelphia County Board of Elections by May 11th at 5pm EST, and due to a high volume of requests, it's a good idea to get a head start.

No matter what your situation is, we've got you covered for requesting a mail-in ballot:

- Have a PennDot ID number or Social Security Number? Request your ballot online
- Rather mail in your frequent form? Print out this form and mail it to "Philadelphia Board of Elections, 142 City Hall, 1400 John F. Kennedy Blvd, Philadelphia, PA 19107"
- No printer, a stamp, or envelope? <u>Click here</u> to have a request form and pre-paid envelope sent to your door

IMPORTANT: To make sure your ballot is counted, be sure to place it inside the provided security envelope before mailing it in.

(NEW) - Shared Call for T32 Nominations: Computational Genomics; Developmental Biology; Cell and Molecular Biology; Genetics

The following training grants are soliciting nominations of graduate students for the 2021-2022 academic year through a BGS-managed web-based system. Training grants fund a significant portion of a student's tuition, fees, and stipend. Appointment to a training grant is recognition of academic promise and distinction and, in some cases, provides additional training opportunities or funds for travel to scientific meetings. To be eligible for consideration, a student must be a US citizen or permanent resident (green card holder) and must have received no more than four years of NRSA funding by the time of appointment. Additional criteria for each grant are specified in the descriptions below. *Please note: you may apply for more than 1 grant, provided you meet the eligibility criteria; however, the grants may have different deadlines, so apply by the earliest deadline.*

Sign up to provide a critical mentored virtual research experience for URMs this summer Deadline: May 1st, 11:59pm

Future applicants with under-represented identities in science and medicine (URiM) are experiencing significant setbacks in applying to combined degree programs this year and beyond. This problem has been significantly exacerbated by the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. The **Virtual Summer Research Program (VSRP) through the American Physician Scientists Association (APSA)**, a program led by the Justice, Equity, Diversity & Inclusion committee, is hoping to bridge this gap, and **we need your help!**

In 2020 we paired 150+ mentors, principal investigators and graduate students with premedical and pre-graduate trainees for mentored research experiences. In 2021, we are hoping to pair 200 URiMs (we anticipate 600+ will apply). Ultimately, we hope to increase diversity by expanding access to dual degree programs to those whose previous research experience was limited by socio-economic factors—and for this, we are asking graduate students, post-docs, and principal investigators in any lab or research group to sign up as mentors for this virtual research experience from June 14th to August 6th 2021. If we want the next generation of scientists to be diverse, we must participate in uplifting URiM applicants that are facing compounded roadblocks due to COVID-19 and ongoing racial and economic disparities that plague our nation. If you are asking yourself, what can I do to increase diversity in biomedical research? Well, this!
