

Penn coordinates an internal competition. The deadline for the internal competition is **10 AM**, **February 5th**, **2019**.

To be considered for Penn nomination, applicants must submit:

- The <u>Regeneron Application Form</u>, which includes upload of a single pdf containing:
 - o Curriculum Vitae, which must include current phone number and mailing address
 - o pdf of 2-3 publications

- 2-page single-spaced description of the applicant's "dream research idea" in the field of Biomedical Science
- A <u>Recommendation Request Form</u> that will, upon completion and submission by the applicant, send a recommendation request to your Penn faculty advisor

External Fellowship - Chateaubriand Fellowship Call for Applications 2019-2020

Complete applications must be submitted by January 8, 2019.

The Chateaubriand Fellowship is a grant offered by the Embassy of France in the United States. It supports outstanding Ph.D. students from American universities who wish to conduct research in France for a period ranging from 4 to 9 months. Chateaubriand fellows are selected through a merit-based competition, through a collaborative process involving expert evaluators in both countries.

Wharton Business Foundations Skills Courses on Coursera

Many BGS students have expressed interest in learning about aspects of business as part of their preparation for various careers. Wharton conducts a series of Coursera courses in business foundations.

The courses are free for people who don't want or need any course credit and simply want exposure to business principles and practices. However, some people may wish to receive credit for individual courses or for a certificate (6 courses including a capstone project). Coursera estimates it takes 4-5 weeks to complete each course.

The cost per month of Coursera is \$79. BGS can reimburse students for up to 7 months of Coursera who show proof of completion. For detailed instructions on reimbursement via Concur, contact <u>Rebecca Lopez</u>.
