

Prism & MATLAB Licenses

2019 marks the 50th anniversary of the PennVet VMD-PhD program. To celebrate this milestone, our Annual Student Research Day will combine with a VMD-PhD 50th Anniversary Symposium to form a two-day research event at Penn Vet.

- **Thursday, March 21, 2019**: Annual Student Research Day (Keynote Lecture: Steve Bensinger VMD-PhD; Towards understanding how lipid metabolism influences immunity)
- **Friday, March 22, 2019**: VMD-PhD 50th Anniversary Symposium "Penn Vet: Advancing Research and Medical Synergies"

The VMD-PhD 50th Anniversary Symposium will include talks from prominent program alumni and a session highlighting on-going research collaborations between PennVet faculty and researchers across campus. The Symposium Keynote Address will be given by Ralph Brinster VMD,PhD who was the first Director of the program and is the Richard King Mellon Professor of Reproductive Physiology at the School of Veterinary Medicine. The title of his Address will be: **Understanding and Modifying the Mammalian Genome**

CPHI Seminar Series: Gary Wu, MD

What's public health got to do with it? The impact of diet and the microbiome on health and disease.

The rapidly increasing incidence of inflammatory and metabolic diseases has had many wondering whether this is being driven by changes in our environment, including the industrialization of our food supply. Current evidence suggests diet not only shapes the microbial communities that live in our intestinal tract, i.e. our microbiome, but also leads to the production of small molecules, or metabolites, that can have a direct effect on our well-being. Using the latest advances in technology, scientists are now beginning to unravel these complex interactions leading to innovative approaches by which these environmental factors can be modified to prevent and/or treat disease. Dr. Gary Wu will discuss the PennCHOP Microbiome Program and our evolving understanding of the microbiome to design interventions to promote health and cure disease. Dr. Wu will also talk about the new Penn Center for Nutritional Science and Medicine, and its focus on the independent effect of diet on human health and disease.

The seminar will take place **Thursday**, **March 28**, **2019** from **12 – 1:30 PM in Gaulton Auditorium** (**Biomedical Research Building**). See Dr. Wu's speaker bio and register <u>here</u>.
