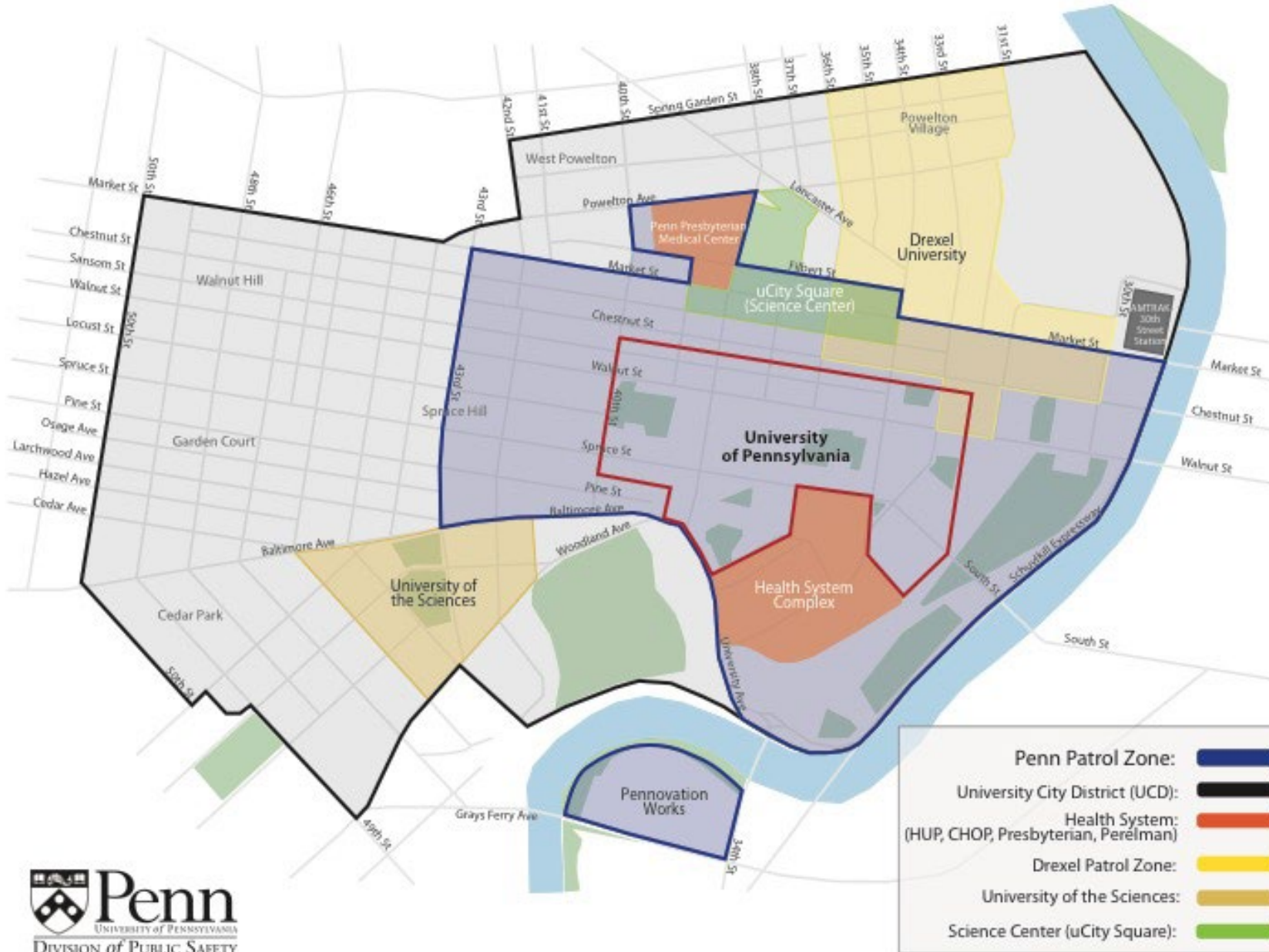
How to contact Penn Police

Baltimore Avenue.

Escorts are also available from 10:00am until 3:00am
between 30th & 50th and Spring Garden Street to
Woodland Avenue.
(SEAMLESS handoff to the UCD)

How to Request a Walking Escort:

- Ask any Public Safety Officer on patrol or inside a building
- Call 215-898-WALK(9255) or 511 (from campus phone)
- Use one of the many building and blue-light phones located on and off Penn's Campus



Special Services

- Options counseling, hospital and court accompaniment
- Self-Defense Training

Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) Team

- Provides crisis intervention to a person or group of people who have experienced a critical incident.
- Designed as emotional “first aid”
- Penn’s CISM Team has over 40 members (DPS, CAPS, VPUL, CHAS, EAP)
