

COVID-19 Requirements

Vaccinations. Penn students, faculty, and staff are required to be vaccinated. Students must upload their vaccine record through <u>Student Health</u>. Information regarding current student immunization requirements can be found <u>here</u>.

Masking/Testing. All members of the Penn community and visitors must wear masks while indoors in public or shared spaces. **Vaccinated students are required to participate in screening testing twice per month**. Learn more about student compliance with testing <u>here</u>.

International Open Access Week 2021

The Penn Libraries are proudly taking part in <u>International Open Access Week 2021</u>, **October 25-31, 2021**. This global event allows the academic and research community to learn about the potential benefits of Open Access and share what they've learned with colleagues. The Penn Libraries will recognize it virtually with two workshops and two panels.

The workshops will provide practical information and hands-on guidance. Scholars will learn how they can highlight their work and easily network and share ideas with colleagues across institutions through participation in open academic profile, sharing, and preprint platforms. In turn, the panels will bring the Penn Community into direct conversation with publishers, journal editors, and other Penn scholars who have chosen to publish, distribute, and/or share their work through open access publishing venues.
