

Patients often travel hundreds of miles to receive transplant care at Penn Medicine. For many, this adds the burden of convenient and affordable housing to an already challenging time.

Recognizing the need to help remedy this problem, the Penn Transplant Institute undertook nearly 10 years of fundraising and in 2011, opened the Clyde F. Barker Penn Transplant House. Since then, The Transplant House has provided a welcoming home away from home for thousands of transplant patients, families and caregivers from almost every state in the U.S. and, from countries across the globe.

In addition to the comfort of the private guest rooms, the house offers a fully equipped kitchen, spacious dining, work, outdoor and lounge spaces where guests can prepare their own meals, do laundry, exercise in the fitness room and access transplant education. But for many people staying at the Transplant House, the most invaluable experience goes beyond the convenience — it is a welcome respite and supportive environment where they share experiences and create connections with other families in similar situations.

Built entirely on philanthropy, thanks in great part to a generous endowment gift from the Board of Women Visitors of the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania, the house continues to operate thanks to the ongoing generosity of patients, families, the Penn community, community organizations, foundations, and corporations.
