Learning Objectives

This module has been designed to address the following learning objectives: Licensed nurses and team members will be able to:

- 1. Describe common factors that are associated with ADEs.
- 2. Describe best drug prescribing practices for nursing homes and other long term care settings.
- 3. Describe the core and supportive roles of health care professionals, CNAs, and family caregivers in medication management.
- 4. Describe a quality improvement approach to preventing, recognizing and managing ADEs.

As you review these objectives, consider:

- Whether you need to *add to or modify* the objectives based on the current knowledge of your staff or your facility's particular needs regarding medication management. The following slides may not be appropriate in community settings: 6, 8, 24, 25, 26, and 28. You should feel free to delete them from your presentation. Some slides may not be helpful to nursing home staff. These include: 5, 7, 27, 29, 30, and 31. You should feel free to delete them from your presentation.
- Wording any additional objectives in terms of what staff will be able to do
 when the program is complete. This format helps to focus on the *out-*comes of education rather than the *process* of education.
- Adding facility data and goals and other information particular to your setting if this module is being used as part of a quality improvement initiative. While it is ideal to *prevent* ADEs, the team/staff should also know how to *handle* them should they occur. Consider including your agency's policies for reporting such events, how to document in the chart/Medication Administration Record (MAR), and how to manage these adverse effects.
- Including *examples and experiences* from your own setting that illustrate the points made.
