People with cancer are living longer.

We can find, prevent (stop) and treat cancer
due to clinical trials.

What is a Clinical Trial?

- Clinical trials are studies to help test new ways to find, prevent and treat cancer.
- Patients in clinical trials are sometimes the first to try newer and better treatments.
- Patients on trials are watched closely by the study team.
- Doctors make sure to reduce a patient's risk. Some treatments don't work for everyone.

Why consider a Clinical Trial?

People take part in clinical trials for many reasons:

- To benefit from the new treatment.
- · To help find better ways to manage cancer.
- To receive the newest therapy earlier.
- To find new ways that will help your family and others.
