

Department of Otolaryngology Research Fellowships

As a Research Fellow, students have the opportunity to engage in a year-long research project with a faculty mentor in the Department of Otolaryngology - Head and Neck Surgery. Each program provides one year of funding and can be tailored to meet the interests of the selected fellow. Students also have the opportunity to shadow clinical activities and are expected to take part in all departmental educational activities, such as head and neck cancer tumor board and grand rounds. The Eugen Grabscheid, MD Research Fellowship

The Eugen Grabscheid Fellowship is a competitive program that provides one-year of funding for medical students to participate in clinical or basic science research. The program is designed to encourage medical students to consider a career in Otolaryngology - Head and Neck Surgery.

The Ronald Hoffman, MD Research Fellowship

The Ronald Hoffman Fellowship is an endowed program established by Dr. Ronald Hoffman, Professor in the Department of Otolaryngology- Head and Neck Surgery, in which the medical student will participate in a one-year clinical or basic science research program. The program is designed to encourage young scholars to pursue a career as a physician scientist.

The William Lawson, MD, DDS Research Fellowship

The William Lawson Scholarship is an endowed program established by Dr. William Lawson, Vice-Chairman and Professor in the Department of Otolaryngology- Head and Neck Surgery, in which the medical student will participate in a one-year clinical or basic science research program. The program is designed to encourage young scholars to pursue a career as a physician scientist.

The Steven Sacks, MD and Carole Sacks Research Fellowship

The Carole and Steven Sacks Research Fellowship is an endowed program established by Dr. Steven Sacks and his late wife Carole Sacks. This fellowship, established over 10 years ago, has been instrumental in furthering the careers of many medical students who wish to pursue a career in Otolaryngology.

Eligibility:

The fellowships are available to students currently in their third year or fourth year of medical school.

Fellowship Awards:

These are independent scholarships, each to be awarded individually. Each student will receive a stipend of \$35,000 for the year to support room and board, with additional funding provided for health benefits.

Application:

Interested students must submit:

- a) A letter of interest.
- b) An up to date CV with current transcript
- c) One letter of recommendation
- d) A personal statement not to exceed one page detailing your motivation to apply for the Fellowship, what you hope to get out of the year and how your prior research or other experiences makes you an outstanding candidate.
