WHAT IS HOSPICE CARE?

Hospice is a philosophy of care for people with serious and progressive illnesses such as heart disease, lung disease, cancer and Alzheimer's disease. People who choose hospice care decide to focus their treatment on symptom relief and quality of life, rather than curing their illness, and are cared for in a home, hospital, nursing home or inpatient hospice unit.

The goal of hospice care is to enable a person to live an alert, symptom-free life. Hospice providers take care of both patients and their families, who together with a patient's doctor, decide when hospice care should begin.

OUR TEAM

Staff collaborate to provide highly skilled and individualized hospice care. Our team members include:

- **Physicians** experienced in end-of-life care, available for home and facility visits for patient care, consultation and oversight.
- Nurses provide direct patient care, illness-related symptom management, education and instruction about at-home care (All patients and families have access to certified hospice and palliative care nurses).
- **Certified home health aides** provide personal care such as bathing, feeding and dressing.
- Licensed clinical social workers offer emotional support and counseling, assistance with insurance and financial questions, and assistance with placement issues if a patient requires an alternative caregiving environment.
- **Masters-prepared chaplains** offer spiritual support to patients and families of all faiths and collaborate with a patient's own clergy when requested.
- Masters-prepared adult and children's bereavement coordinators provide individual and group therapy, phone support and bereavement services up to one year after the death of a loved one.
- **Specially trained hospice volunteers** offer companionship, comfort and emotional support, as well as assistance with reading and writing letters and running errands.
- In addition, our partnership with Penn Home Infusion Therapy allows seamless access to IV therapies required for symptom management.
