Eligibility Information

In order to receive home health services, patients must need care only on a part-time basis. Many insurances will not pay for home health staff to stay with patients for an extended period of time. Home health visits are provided for the length of time it takes to stabilize and instruct the patient or caregiver in the specific treatments and medications ordered by their doctor.

To receive Penn Home Palliative Care, you must live in Philadelphia, Chester, Delaware, Bucks, or Montgomery County. You also must be homebound. Medicare, Medicaid, and certain insurances can be used to pay.

- After-hours emergency support via telephone or nurse visit
- Assistance in completing an advance directive or living will
- Support for family and caregivers
- Telemedicine

ABOUT THE TEAM

Our team includes:

- Registered Nurses visit the patient at home.
 Their goal is to make the patient as comfortable as possible through expert nursing care and coordination with the patient's physician.
- Home Health Aides help with personal care, feeding, bathing, dressing, and changing linens.
- Social Workers provide support for daily needs, such as meal delivery, emotional support and community support.
- Physical, Occupational, Speech, and Language Therapists help the patient stay as independent as possible through exercises and training.
- **Nurse Practitioners** help address complex issues such as symptom management.

Support for the Entire Family

Penn Home Palliative Care also supports the patient's family and caregivers. Advanced illness can affect more than the patient, and we can help families participate in care through education, advice, and support.
