

## Academic Clinician Research Effort and Involvement Policy

Effective: October 1, 2022 Supersedes: January 1, 2021

## Background

Academic Clinician (AC) faculty play large roles in clinical research and particularly clinical trials. Given that there remains a need to retain a distinction between the research activities of AC and CE faculty, effective 12/1/2020, the following applies to AC faculty related to research effort and involvement:

- AC Faculty may serve as PI/co-PI/sub-investigator and accept role specific support for non- federally sponsored clinical research and non-federally sponsored cooperative group trials.
- Generally, AC Faculty may not be PI or have a leadership role on federally sponsored research.
- Total research activity on NIH awards or their equivalent is limited to 10% effort unless serving in a support role for clinical research, clinical trials or informatics.

The academic plan will reflect this definition as follows:

\_\_\_\_Clinical
\_\_\_\_Teaching and other activities not to exceed a total of 10% combined effort unless funding is available for specific roles and responsibilities.

\_\_\_\_Teaching (minimum 5%)

\_\_\_\_Other (includes referring patients for clinical trials, committee work, any other function assigned by chair etc.)

\_\_\_\_Administrative Role(s)

\_\_\_\_Research activity (must satisfy the following conditions):

• May serve as PI/co-PI/sub-investigator and accept role specific support for non-federally sponsored clinical research and cooperative group trials;

• Generally, may not be PI or have a leadership role on federally sponsored research;

• Total research activity on NIH awards or their equivalent is limited to 10% unless serving in a support role for clinical research, clinical trials or informatics (ex:

enrolling and monitoring patients in a clinical trial).
