Senior Fellows Spotlight: Danielle Cullen, MD, MPH, MSHP



Danielle Cullen is an Assistant Professor of Pediatrics and Pediatric Emergency Medicine, Director of Health Services and Health Equity Research for the Division of Emergency Medicine at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia (CHOP), and Associate Director of Implementation Science at CHOP Clinical Futures. The goal of her research portfolio is to improve health equity among socially disadvantaged children through the development of effective, acceptable, and feasible strategies to identify unmet social need and

improve family engagement with desired resources. She is dedicated to community involvement in research and programmatic design, and leverages methods from Community-Based Participatory Research and Implementation Science to enhance reach and sustainability of developed programs. Her ongoing implementation research includes: a hybrid implementation-effectiveness study of the USDA's summer food service program across CHOP clinical settings; a multi-center implementation trial of social support in the Emergency Department (ED); and a mixed-methods evaluation of individual and system level barriers to dental care after ED referral.

Senior Fellows Spotlight: Robert Schnoll, PhD



Dr. Robert Schnoll is the John H. Glick, MD Professor in Cancer Research and Director of the Center for Interdisciplinary Research on Nicotine Addiction in the Department of Psychiatry at the University of Pennsylvania, Associate Director for Population Science at the Penn Abramson Cancer Center, and Co-Director of the Community Research and Engagement Core for the Penn Center for AIDS Research. He is an implementation scientist and nicotine addiction researcher, leading studies on ways to improve the use and effectiveness of treatments for

nicotine dependence, particularly among under-resourced communities, and leading studies evaluating the use of implementation strategies to address practice gaps across medicine, particularly in the context of cancer care. Dr. Schnoll currently co-leads the Penn Implementation Science Center in Cancer Control (Penn ISC3), a P50 funded by NCI, co-leads an R01 testing implementation strategies informed by behavioral economics to improve the use of genetic testing in cardiology and neurology, and co-leads 2 R01s testing

treatments for nicotine dependence among people living with HIV (PWH).
