This role includes managing databases, developing analytical plans, and carrying out analysis for projects related to gynecologic cancer and health equity projects. The opportunity provides mentorship and publication opportunities in the field of implementation of cancer prevention and control studies among high-risk and underserved populations.

<u>Annual Pilot Research Awards - CFAR</u>

The Penn Center for AIDS Research (CFAR) has released it's annual application for \$50,000 pilot research awards. This year, they are particularly interested in funding pilot work related to Implementation Science to capitalize on promising scientific breakthroughs to end the HIV epidemic in the U.S. Faculty who have not previously been funded to do HIV research but have an interest in expanding their work to include HIV prevention or treatment are encouraged to apply.
