Senior Fellows Spotlight: Gwendolyn Lawson, PhD



Gwendolyn Lawson, PhD is an Assistant Professor of Psychiatry at the University of Pennsylvania and a faculty member in PolicyLab and Clinical Futures at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. Dr. Lawson's research program aims to leverage implementation science methods to increase the quality of services youth with or at-risk for mental health

problems receive in community settings, particularly schools. For example, she recently completed a K23 award from the National Institute of Mental Health (NIMH), which culminated in a small-scale hybrid implementation-effectiveness pilot trial of a set of

implementation strategies to support teachers in using evidence-based behavior management practices. She is now extending that work with a newly-funded R34 grant that aims to develop and pilot test a coordinated set of implementation resources for parents and caregivers. Together, these projects highlight how individuals other than traditionally-trained mental health clinicians can be conceptualized as the implementers of evidence-based practice and supported using approaches from implementation science. Dr. Lawson is also beginning to work on new collaborations in which she serves as an implementation scientist to support projects focused on other content areas.

Senior Fellows Spotlight: Karen Glanz, PhD, MPH



Karen Glanz, PhD, MPH is a George A. Weiss University Professor, and Professor in the Perelman School of Medicine (PSOM) and the School of Nursing, at the University of Pennsylvania (UPenn); Dr. Glanz is also an affiliate Professor in Medical Ethics and Health Policy. Her research in community and healthcare settings focuses on obesity, nutrition, skin cancer prevention; and the built environment; reducing health disparities;

dissemination and implementation science; and health communication. Dr. Glanz's research and publications about understanding, measuring and improving healthy food environments, beginning in the 1980's, has been widely recognized and replicated. Current research includes a large implementation trial of social incentives to increase physical activity in families, and a new study of people's experiences with and attitudes toward weight loss medication (GLP-R1A's). Together with colleagues at UPenn and Jefferson, she lead the recently funded UPenn Prevention Research Center which is conducting two implementation studies – one of doctor-patient communication with older cancer patients, and the other that focuses on implementing risk assessments in disadvantaged patients at federally-qualified health centers (FQHC's).


