

Dennis H. Li (he/him) is an assistant professor at Northwestern University in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences and at the Institute for Sexual and Gender Minority Health and Wellbeing. His work centers on the application of implementation science (IS) methods to help end the HIV epidemic in the US. Within HIV prevention, he focuses on the development and delivery of digital sexual health programs for adolescent and young adult sexual minority men.




