Pragmatic Clinical Research Institute - HPR 6260

November 4 - 7, 2024 Virtual

The course HPR 6260 (0.5CU) is now available in the Fall 2024 course listing; you can use your Penn tuition credit if not currently enrolled in a degree program. The institute will be held virtually November 4-7, 2024 from 12-5PM each day.

Summary. This virtual, interactive and synchronous institute offers an intensive glimpse into the design and conduct of pragmatic observational studies and clinical trials in the health care setting. The course is designed to offer foundational understanding, resources, and skills relevant to learners at all career stages with interests in clinical research, learning health system science, and health system quality improvement. Attendees will learn the unique value and challenges of pragmatic research studies within the hierarchy of evidence-based medicine. Attendees will understand the basic tenets of design, methodology, and analysis; key considerations of ethics and equity; and opportunities for synergy across behavioral, predictive, and implementation sciences in the conduct of pragmatic research studies. Through synchronous didactic and small group sessions and complementary asynchronous reading and online discussions, attendees will have the opportunity to discuss with experts and peers how these learnings can directly inform and apply to their own areas of research and intervention development.

Audience. This course is intended for learners at all career stages of clinical research, learning health system science, or health system quality improvement.

REQUIREMENTS

- Attendance for all 4 days is required to obtain full course credit (0.5CU).
- Attendance for single days is acceptable, without course credit.
- Participation in breakout groups and online discussions is expected.
- Prior coursework, training, and/or experience in health services research, public health, epidemiology, quality improvement or health care organization leadership helpful, not required

17th Annual Conference on the Science of Dissemination and Implementation

December 8-11, 2024 Crystal Gateway Marriott, Arlington, VA

This year's conference theme, *Moving Fast and Slow: Optimizing the Pace of Implementation*, will address the underexplored concept of the pace of D&I. The D&I science community has known for decades that it takes too long for too little of evidence-based care to reach everyone who could benefit. Much energy has been spent on the second part of the equation—can we increase the volume of evidence-based care delivered—with less attention to the optimal pace at which this should happen. In the 17th year of the D&I Conference, we will explore methodological advancements, challenges and opportunities to understanding how to investigate and optimize implementation pace across health care, and community and public health systems.

Assistant Scientist with the REACH Equity Team at the University of Miami

The position will be hired primarily to work on an Ro1 project called "SOMOS Alianza" which is studying local implementation strategies in Miami, Orlando, and San Juan that are already being used in community HIV organizations. The project then involves using a systematic method to evaluate those implementation strategies and scale them up to other HIV organizations. The implementation strategies we are studying are those that seek to improve the reach of PrEP and mental health/substance use treatment services to Latino MSM. The Assistant Scientist would serve as an overall project director and need to have implementation science experience/training to scientifically support the project. They will also provide as needed support on other implementation science focused projects across the research team.

Research Study Coordinators (2) at Northwestern University Feinburg School of Medicine

The Department of Medical Social Sciences at Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine is seeking two Research Study Coordinators to assist our team with our diverse research portfolio focused on closing gaps between what is known and what is done ("know-do gaps") in healthcare delivery to improve equitable and high quality healthcare—also known as implementation science. We anticipate several new projects starting in the late summer and fall, all focused on implementation of evidence-based practices related to mental health, including:

- Investigating unintended consequences of implementation of toddler mental health screening, identification, and intervention;
- Implementation of the collaborative care model for mental health treatment in

- primary care settings; and
- Implementation of a secure firearm storage program to prevent youth suicide and unintentional injury in health centers in Illinois.

This is a hybrid work position and the Research Study Coordinators will be expected to work in the office at least three days per week.
