COVID 19 Specimen Collection Practice Change to Anterior Nares

What: Practice Change from Nasopharyngeal to Anterior Nares COVID 19 Specimen Collection Why: Anterior Nares is less invasive and less technically complex reducing patient discomfort. When: Wednesday, June 24th, 2020

Who: Nurses Performing COVID 19 Specimen Collection

Where: All COVID 19 Testing Sites (excludes Sayre Testing Sites)

COVID 19 Anterior Nares Specimen Collection Procedure

- 1. Perform Hand Hygiene & don PPE, according to current guidance from Infection Control.
- 2. Confirm Order in Epic COVID-19 (SARS-CoV-2)
- 3. Verify patient identity using 2 patient identifiers.
- 4. Open specimen collection kit a single swab should be used to sample both nares.
- 5. Grasp the swab (above the demarcated line) like a pencil to accommodate any resistance encountered during insertion.
- Insert the swab at least 1 cm (0.5 inch) inside the nostril (naris) and firmly sample the nasal membrane by rotating the swab in a circular motion at least 2 times (CDC & Penn Medicine Lab Service Guide).
- 7. Leave in place for 10 to 15 seconds to absorb secretions (CDC).
- 8. Repeat the process for the other nostril using the same swab.
- 9. Place the swab immediately into the sterile viral transport media/sterile saline vial. The shaft of swab can be snapped off at the demarcated line, and the tube should be closed tightly.
- 10. Label specimen & verify identity using 2 patient identifiers.
- 11. Doff PPE & perform hand hygiene.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: What specimen collection kit should be used for anterior nares?

A: You will most likely be using the same specimen collection kits used for Nasopharygneal COVID 19 testing.

Q: Does this change specimen storage or PPE? A: No, specimen storage and PPE are unchanged from previous practice – follow the same procedure used for other COVID 19 specimen collection.

Q: Can we ask patients presenting to the testing sites to swab themselves?

A: Nurses should continue to collect the specimens at this time.

Q: Can medical assistants perform anterior nares specimen collection?

A: The clinical operations team will communicate to practice leadership when medical assistants are trained to perform anterior nares specimen collection. At this time, nurses should continue to collect specimens.
